An Opportunity to Join a Statewide Effort to Track Aquatic Invasive Species!

During the July 4th holiday week, MiCorps is inviting conservation districts, CISMAS, watershed groups, and other partners to help spread the word about a low-effort, high-impact opportunity for Michiganders to document potential aquatic invasive species- just by snapping photos with iNaturalist!


From June 28 – July 6, 2025, MiCorps is inviting boaters, paddlers, anglers, and interested individuals to help document Michigan's aquatic species while they're already out enjoying the water.


How it Works:

- Encourage participation by hosting a community collection day, group outing, or simply just participate by sharing this opportunity with your volunteers, members, and networks.
- Engage however works best for your organization- no set commitments! Participants simply take photos of anything they think may be invasive within the allotted dates.
- Participants upload to iNaturalist, where other users can help with identification.
- All data contributes to a statewide snapshot of what's out there!
